Prof John Christodoulou is currently the Chair of Genomic Medicine, Department of Paediatrics, University of Melbourne, and the Head of the Neurodevelopmental Genomics Research Group, at the Murdoch Childrens Research Institute in Melbourne, Australia.

He has an active laboratory-based and clinical mitochondrial research program, and has a major research interest in the application of next generation sequencing (NGS) technologies for disease gene discovery in rare Mendelian disorders, and is the co-lead of the Australian Genomics Health Alliance, whose focus is to bring NGS diagnostics into mainstream clinical practice in Australia.

John is a former Past President (2005-2007) of the Human Genetics Society of Australasia, has served on the NHMRC Principal Committee, the Human Genetics Advisory Committee since 2009. In 2010 he became a Member of the General Division of the Order of Australia (AM) for service to human genetics, particularly the metabolic disorders of children, as a researcher and clinician.
